Durrell Challenge 2021 – who can participate in the Jersey race?

Due to the ongoing uncertainties surrounding COVID-19 and with continued government restrictions in place for international travel and events, the 13K road race in Jersey will once again only be open to residents of the island. Owing to its success in 2020, the 13K Virtual Run will take place again this year so that our overseas runners can complete the challenge closer to home.

Will there be any COVID-19 event mitigations to follow?

For Jersey runners (residents only), we will be staging the 13K road race with 3 waves of 200 mixed runners. The first wave will start at 09:00 with 30-minute intervals for each wave.

The 13K road race on 23 May is subject to the Bailiff Chambers permit and the event complying with the Government of Jersey's events policy that is in place on the date of the race.

Will there be race chip technology?

The 13K road race on 23 May is subject to the Bailiff Chambers permit and the event complying with the Government of Jersey's events policy that is in place on the date of the race. This could mean that we will be unable to provide race chip technology due to the restrictions on travel/mass gatherings. In such a situation, organizers will record all runners' times manually.

Will there be water stations?

We will continue with some of our Covid-19 mitigation plans which means we will operate water stations on the course. Runners are encouraged to run with their own water and nutrition if required.

Will there be post-race massage services?

We will continue with some of our Covid-19 mitigation plans which means we will not be able to offer post-race massage services.

What will happen to my entry if the Durrell Challenge 2021 race in Jersey is cancelled due to Government policy?

If the event is forced to be cancelled, local runners will be automatically transferred to the 13K Virtual Run and receive a £10 discount on entry for the Durrell Challenge 2022.

Can I walk or jog the Durrell Challenge race in Jersey?

11:15 is the race cut-off time, giving you 2 hours and 15 minutes to complete the course. At this time the authorities will open the roads, honorary police and marshals will stand down, however all directional signage will remain in place. The finish line will remain open for longer should there still be runners on the course, but please note that any runners continuing to run after the cut-off time will be doing so at their own risk and must follow the normal rules of running on a road.

Is there an age restriction for the Durrell Challenge 13K race in Jersey?

Runners must be at least 16 years old on the day of the race (23 May 2021).

Can I walk or jog the Durrell Challenge 13K Virtual Run?

The 13K Virtual Run does not have a cut off time, so you can run, walk, jog, or skip the distance should you wish!

Is there an age restriction for the Durrell Challenge 13K Virtual Run?

Due to our UK Athletics virtual race licence, runners who enter must be at least 16 years old on the day of the race (23 May 2021).

Does my 13K race ticket allow me entry to Jersey Zoo?

Yes, the 13K race ticket does allow free entry into Jersey Zoo after the race.

Where can I park?

Parking is available at Jersey Zoo, however, parking is limited so we suggest people car-share if possible.
